Starbucks in Indigo, recycler preps Century City HQ, Belle Meade shops get facelift, and more...

Parts of the first and second floors of Hotel Indigo at the corner of Third and Union will be Nashville's newest Starbucks location after a \$354,000 upgrade. R.C. Mathews will handle the project.

Messer Construction will do the work on the next phase of Nashville International Airport's upgrade and re-location of the baggage screening equipment. This phase represents \$8.4 million of the \$31 million project, paid mostly through Homeland Security and Transportation Security Administration grants.

The Gujarat Cultural Association, one of Nashville's largest Indian community groups, is upgrading its community center at 4418 Lebanon Pike. The GCA has contracted with Creasy Construction for \$230,000 in upgrades to the sanctuary.

Nashville West continues to fill out its space. Results Physiotherapy is working with The Baird Graham Company to finish its 2,242-square-foot shell in the shopping center. The work will cost \$137,547.

Aluminum giant Novelis has contracted with Duke Construction on a \$108,000 upgrade to office space on Century Boulevard. This will likely serve as the Nashville headquarters for Evermore, a joint recycling venture between Novelis and fellow aluminum industry leader Alcoa. An Alcoa representative **told us in August** Evermore would headquarter in the Music City.

Belle Meade Galleria will get a slight facelift. Conrad Construction has the contract for \$60,000 to improve the mall's parking lot entrances and build a new monumental staircase.

Vanderbilt University has contracted with Orion Construction to build a cryostat lab. Renovations for the lab, on the fifth floor of VU's physics building in the Stevenson Science Complex, will cost \$250,000.
